

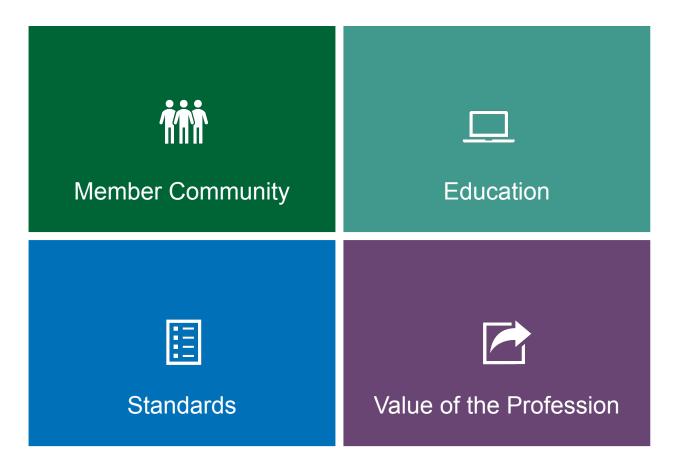

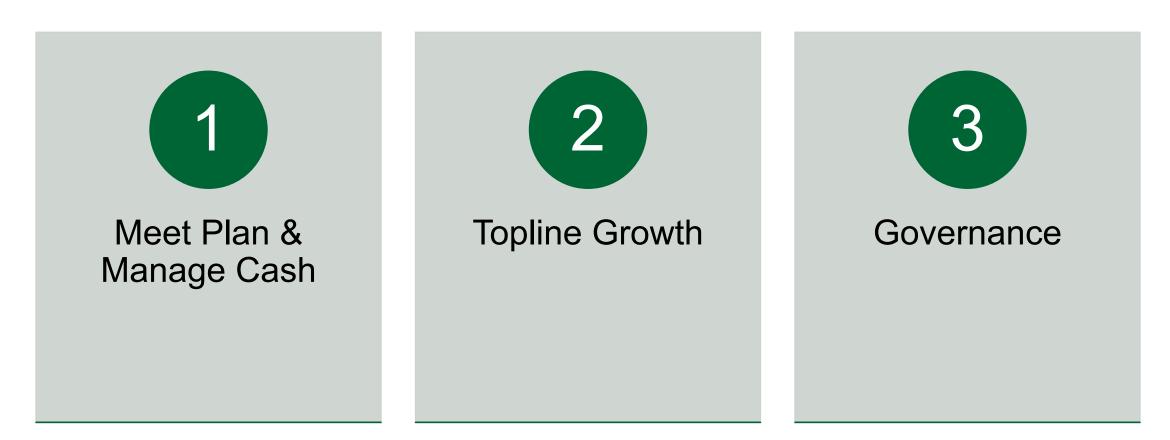
#### **ASSP Strategic Priorities**

## Goal 1: Meet Plan & Manage Cash



### **ASSP Financial Update**

- **P&L**: On track for a significantly lower than budgeted loss for the year.
  - Forecasting an expected loss of (\$500k)
- PPP Ioan: SBA forgave \$1.5MM loan in January 2022.
- Insurance Claim: Have settled and collected on claims for PDC/Safety 2020 as well as educational seminars.
  - Safety 2020/PDC Total settlement of \$5.164 million.
  - Education seminars Total settlement of \$315,000.
- Line of Credit: Not yet accessed.
- Investment Reserves: Remain strong at \$10.1 million at end of February 2022



### **Planning for Future Program Years**

#### Projected budget for FY23 (April 1, 2022 – March 31, 2023)

- Revenue = \$15,474,000
- •Expense = \$16,243,000
- Profit / (Loss) = (\$768,000)

#### FY23 Assumptions/Risks

- Attendance at Safety 2022 in Chicago will be rebound strongly benefiting the conference and expo.
- Costs in Chicago will be significantly higher than other recent PDCs.
- There is demand for event-base education along with a virtual option. The budget meets this demand by including 2 SafetyFocus events.
- Membership numbers and dues revenue begin to grow.
- Continue cost controls, while remaining competitive in the labor market to meet operational staffing needs.

# Membership

#### **Membership – March 1**

- ASSP total membership on March 1, 2022, was 36,076 a -.57% decrease from March 1, 2021
  - Full paid declined -1.7%, at 26,913
  - All paid declined -2.7%, at 32,863
- The overall membership retention remained at 81%
  - Full paid member remained at 88%
    - Exceeding our membership KPI of retaining 80% of full paid members
  - All paid increase to 82% from 80%

 In partnership with the ASSP Foundation, selected to receive \$75,000 grant to develop 6 online modules on PPE.

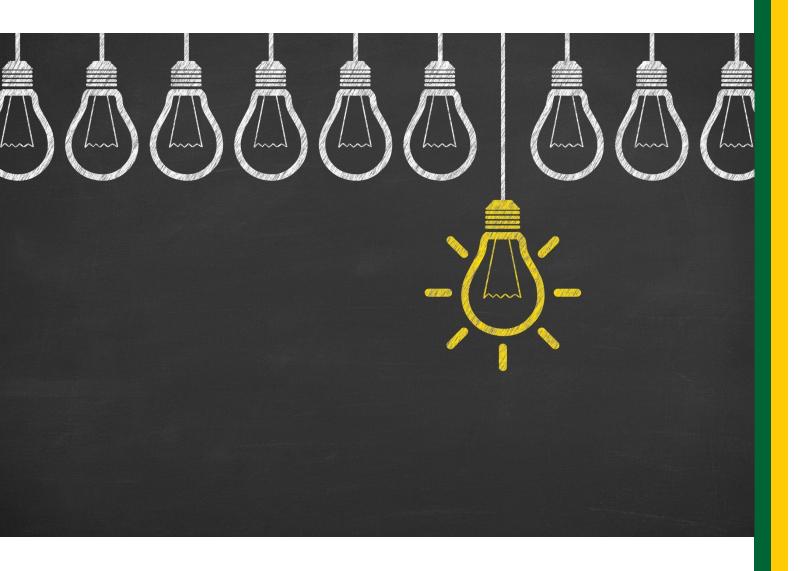
#### **CDC-NISOSH** Training Program
